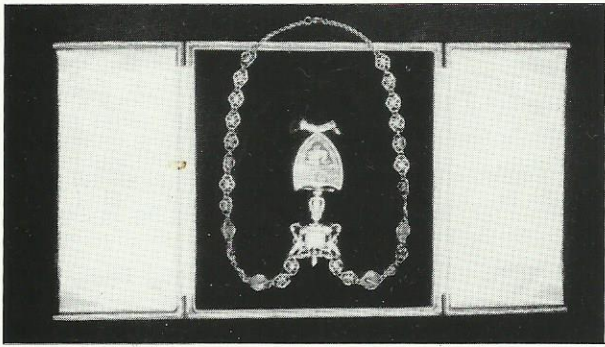

SOME RECENT ADDITIONS



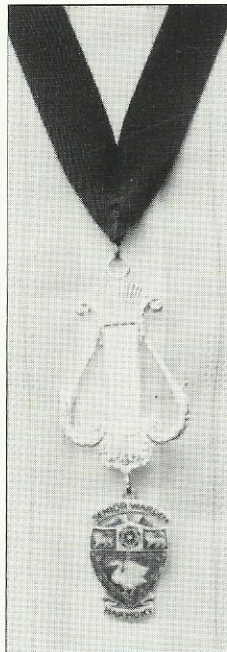

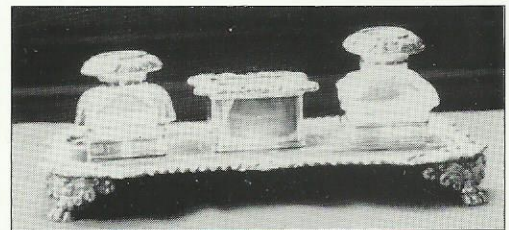
