P. M. Capt. A. C. Chamber stated that he thought there might be a possibility of the refusal of permission by the War Office for Band Masters to wear the Company's silver medal being reconsidered in view of the large number of foreign and miscellaneous decorations now authorized and he thought it might be worth while to approach the Army Council again on the subject.
