P. M. Hill having drawn attention to the fact that in 1794 Court Fees for attendance were 5/- These were raised in 1805 to 10/- and again in 1860 to £1.1.0, but he said he could find no legal obligation in the old bye-laws for the payment of any fees at all.

It was unanimously resolved to recommend that having regard to the resolution of the Court on the 24th October 1916 whereby Court fees were suspended until six months after the termination of the War (i.e. the 10th July 1920) the payment of fees be further suspended until the October Court 1921 and that the future payment of fees for an ensuing year be annually considered and decided at the October Courts.

It was also unanimously resolved not to recommend any increase of (a) the Livery Admission fees (b) the Court Admission fees and (c) the fees payable on admission of prominent professional musicians.
