Recommended that the Clerk be provided with a proper Gown and the Beadle with a Gown and lace Hat

Mr. Powell, Painter in Heraldry, attending, acquainted the Committee that the Lord Mayor had desired him to paint His Lordship's Banner, which he intended to present to the Company, which, with the Company's Banner, would be prepared in time, and, together with the Colours of the Bowyers Company, under his Care, would make a complete Set, and undertook to send a proper Person to superintend the marshaling of the Procession

Recommended that Mrs Hill of Aldersgate Street do provide the necessary Sashes and Cockades - the Colours of which are to be pale Blue and Yellow to correspond with the Company's Arms.

That Mr. Corroch provide proper Gowns &c on the several Days.
