**83. Girlguiding LaSER**

**84. ASDAN education**

**85. Worshipful Company of Butchers**

The Butchers' Company, one of the seven oldest City Livery Companies with records dating back to the year 975, was granted its Royal Charter by James I in 1605. Its thriving and growing membership provides leading support for its continuing responsibility towards the meat industry and to many charitable organisations. Its participation today highlights the Company's historic connection with the City and significant involvement in the industry.



**86. Royal Marines Band (HMS Collingwood)**

The Royal Marines Band Service is renowned for the musical and visual splendour of its marching bands and the versatility of its musicians and buglers. This versatility is also demonstrated on operations, most recently in Afghanistan. The Band of HM Royal Marines Collingwood was formed in June 2009 and has performed at the Lord Mayor's Show, Windsor Castle Royal Tattoo and the wedding of Their Royal Highnesses the Duke and Duchess of Cambridge.



**87. Royal Navy (HMS Collingwood)**

HMS Collingwood is the home of the Maritime Warfare School. It contributes to the operational capability of the Fleet by providing first-class training to all officers and ratings of the Royal Navy in their professional specialisations, which include, weapon engineering, communications and warfare.



**88. Royal Marines**

The Corps of Her Majesty's Royal Marines is the Marine Corps and amphibious infantry of the United Kingdom, which, along with the Royal Navy and Royal Fleet Auxiliary, form the Naval service. The Royal Marines are also the UK's specialists in amphibious warfare, including the operation of landing craft, mountain and Arctic warfare.



**89. RNR London Division (HMS President)**

HMS President is London's Royal Naval reserve unit. It is located in a stunning position just downstream of Tower Bridge. With nearly 250 officers and ratings from the City and areas surrounding London, it is the largest Royal Naval Reserve (RNR) unit in the UK.



**90. Royal Marines Reserve (City of London)**

The Royal Marines Reserve (City of London) is responsible for recruiting and training individual reservist commandos who augment the regular Royal Marines when required. It has seamlessly integrated with 3 Commando Brigade through operations in Iraq and the Afghan campaign. The unit has mobilised 25 per cent of its manpower for the London 2012 venue security, for River Thames maritime security and Operation Herrick in Afghanistan. It has a barracks in Wandsworth and detachments in Henley, Portsmouth and Cambridge.
