Mr. Stagg to be put in Nomination for the same.

There being a Vacancy in the Committee by the death of the
said Mr. Walker Mr. Robert Holder was propos'd by Mr.
Alderman Woodbridge.

A Motion was made and Question put that the
Steward and Livery Fines be consolidated and that the Sum
of £15⁰ 15⁰ 0 be in future paid under the Denomination of
Livery-fine in lieu of all Fees whatsoever And that all person,
who have been already admitted to the Livery shall still be
subject to pay their Stewards-fines as heretofore: Which was
resolved in the Affirmative.
