This Resolution was seconded by Mr. G. E. Cooper, but it was pointed out by several Members of the Court that having regard to the Resolutions passed at the Court held on the 28th October last, it would be better to wait at any rate until the end of the present financial year.

Sir Homewood Crawford accordingly moved as an amendment that any suggestion for the suspension of fees should be deferred till the end of the present financial year. This amendment was seconded by the Junior Warden and on being put to the meeting was carried.
