Cobbett Prize } The Master reported that Mr. W. W. Cobbett a Liveryman of the
Competitions } Company had presented a further £60 to be devoted in giving four
commissions to young British composers for further Phantasies; that Mr.
Cobbett desired still to associate this work with the name of the Company
and that if the Company would agree to the scheme he had selected
the following Gentlemen as Composers

- 1 Frank Bridge to write a Quartett for piano and strings
- 2 James Friskin to write a Quintett for piano and strings
- 3 B. J. Dale to write a Phantasia for viola and piano
- 4 W. O. Donnell to write a Phantasia for cello and piano

The Master stated that two of these composers had been students at the Royal Academy of Music and two of the Royal College of Music that Mr. Friskin and Mr. O'Donnell were Medallists of the Company and
