

Musicians asking for a subscription to a fund that was being got up to meet the costs to which Messrs Herbert Fryer and Norman Nolley, two professional musicians, and both Professors of the Royal College of Music, had been put, in connection with a recent litigation as to the meaning of a legal musical nuisance, but it was decided that the Company had no funds available for the purpose.

Miss Adeline S. Bridge

Further application from Miss Adeline S. Bridge was made for a grant from the Benevolent Fund. J. M. Hill raised the question that a donation of this description ought not to be paid out of the Benevolent Fund, which hereafter might have many claims upon it, and on the proposition of Mr W. H. Ash, seconded by the Acting Master it was decided to make Miss Bridge a donation of £10.10.0 out of the General Fund.

Board Dinners Morning Dress

A letter was read from the Master, protesting against the resolution of the Board of the 25th April last, (when he was not present) to the effect that the January and July Dinners should be in morning dress, without music or guests, and giving notice of his intention to move that such resolution should be rescinded.

Guildhall School of Music

The Clerk reported that the Secretary of the Guildhall School of Music had promised in future to see that the Carnegie and Palmer Scholarships were announced in the press as "Carnegie Scholarship (or Palmer Scholarship) of the Worshipful Company of Musicians".

Stationers Hall

The question of heating the Vestibule which was bitterly cold in Winter weather, was raised, and the Clerk was requested to communicate with the Stationers' Company on the subject.
