

On Wednesday the 5<sup>th</sup> June 1907, being the 282<sup>nd</sup> Anniversary of the death of Orlando Gibbons, a Bust of the famous Organist in black marble which is a replica of his Bust in Canterbury Cathedral was unveiled at Westminster Abbey by Her Royal Highness The Princess Christian of Schleswig-Holstein who was accompanied by her Daughter Princess Louise Augusta and a special commemorative service was held at which the music given was composed entirely by Gibbons and was under the direction of Sir Frederick Bridge M.V.O., M.A., Mus.Doc. a Past Master of the Company.

The Choir consisted of about 300 Singers drawn from the leading Choirs and a large String Band.

The Bust was presented by C. J. D. Crews Esq. D.L., J.P., F.S.A., a Past Master of the Company by whom the whole of the expenses in connection with the celebration were also generously defrayed.
