The Minutes of the last Court were read and confirmed.

Paid 12 Gent^{rs} of the Court 5/each £3.0.0

Mr. Job Williams paid his Livery & Stewards Fines of £15.15. and 2/6 to the poor

Declared a vacancy on the Court of Assistants in the room of Samuel Bosworth Esq. decd. nominations to be made at the next Court and to be filled up at the then ensuing Court.

A vacancy was declared by the Master, with the concurrence of the Court, pursuant to the Charter, of an Assistant of this Company, in the room of Mr. Alderman Watson who has been absent two years and upwards; but the Court, considering that the Alderman was employed abroad in the public Service of the Country, Resolved that part of a bye Law of this Company in the following words that is to say — "the said Assistants upon neglecting to attend the duties of the Office for two years successively are to be considered as having resigned and new Members are to be chosen in their room" — be in this Instance suspended and unanimously re-elected Mr. Alderman Watson an Assistant of this Company.
