The Report of the Committee with reference to the Scholarships to be awarded to two Students at the Guildhall School of Music (a Part of which had been sent to every Member of the Court) was further considered and some slight alterations made therein it being among other things decided that in testing for the Scholarships it should be imperative that the Candidates showed distinct ability in reading Music at sight and that the Scholarships should be awarded to those who evinced the best aptitude in sight reading.

It was also decided that the Scholars elected should bear the title of "The Musicians Company Carnegie Scholars" and on the proposition of the Master seconded by the Senior Warden it was unanimously resolved that the Report as amended should be received and adopted.
