The Committee proceeded to examine the Beadle's Collection of Quarterage together with his Fees and Perquisites which was referr'd to their Consideration at the last Court and find that he has received on an Average (all Emoluments included) between £18 & £20 $\frac{1}{2}$ Annum - Observing also in the Course of their Examination that the Beadle has taken extraordinary Pains in collecting the Quarterage and been diligent in other Respects are of Opinion that the Sum of £5 5.0⁰ be given him as a Premium for his Assiduity, but not to be Considered as a Precedent.

The Committee taking into Consideration Mr. Gaudron's Motion upon the 15th of July last "that a true Copy of the Charter be printed and sent to every Livery-man with a View to discover what Powers were vested in the Court of Assistants and what in the Livery"
