

and late Lord Mayor he went on board the Barges, after which the Gentlemen proceeded in Coaches to Westminster, where they received His Lordship on his landing and attended him to the Exchequer Chamber during the Ceremony of His Lordship's being sworn in before the Barons, then took Coach to Temple Lane, where His Lordship landed on his return (on account of the Sewer near Blackfryers Bridge being under Repair) and discharging the Coaches there, preceded the State Carriage on foot with Music playing and Colours flying to Guildhall and from thence to the Saint Pauls Coffee-house where they dined.
