Sections of Church Choirs may enter for Classes 4, 5, 11 and 12.

Adjudicator - D^r W^m Phillips. Entrance Fee 7s. 6d.

Prize: A Challenge Shield, given by The Worshipful Company of Musicians. To be held by the Prize-winners for one year and to be returned to the Secretary of the Festival one week before the 1914 Festival. Winners will be expected to insure the Shield against Fire and Burglary, and to accept liability for any damage to the trophy whilst in the Holders' possession and until returned.
