Sir Ernest Clarke reported that acting on the instructions given at the last Court a letter had been addressed by the Clerk to Col. the Hon. Robert White the then Commandant of the 2/10<sup>th</sup> (Service) Battalion of the Royal Fusiliers, suggesting that if the Battalion were unable to utilise the Band Instruments which had been presented to it in October last, they should be returned to the Company. A reply had been received from Col. White dated the 22<sup>nd</sup> July stating that it was proposed to retain the 3 Bugles and the Cymbals included in the Instruments presented to the Battalion, and "deeply regretting we have not been able to make more use of this very gracious gift, for which we are none the less grateful." Col. White mentioned that the other instruments (Fifes and Drums) had been deposited at an address at Richmond to which he had written to say that they were there to be held at the Company's orders. The Clerk had thereupon thanked Col. White for his letter and sent the Company's good wishes for the Battalion, which was about to proceed to the front. Instructions had then been given to Messrs Hawkes and Son, who supplied the instruments, to send their van to Richmond for the fifes and drums, and to keep them in store pending the Company's further instructions. He (Sir Ernest Clarke) had inspected the instruments, none of which appeared to have been actually used, and he gathered that Messrs Hawkes & Son would be willing to take them back at or about the price the Company had paid for them in exchange for other instruments
