(Alteration of Rules) Sir Hugh Allen reported that the Adjudicators Dr Ralph Vaughan Williams and Mr Arnold Bax were of the opinion that the rules for the fellowship should be altered so as to throw the fellowship open to any candidate not necessarily from any one Foundation if duly nominated by the appointed Nominators: and further that the lower age limit be raised to 27 or 30.
