The Reverend R. H. Hadden in pursuance of Notice moved that in view of his probable election to the Office of Lord Mayor at Michaelmas 1908 Alderman Sir George Wyatt Tuscott be elected a Member of the Court ranking as an Assistant in accordance with the date of his Admission to the Livery

This was seconded by Mr. Tescher but the opinion was expressed by several Members that it would be a greater honour to elect Sir George Wyatt Tuscott as Master direct from the Livery in October 1908 when he would in all probability be Lord Mayor Elect and after discussion it was arranged that the matter should stand over until the next Court so that the Court might have the benefit of the Masters views upon it
