The Court this Day came to the following Resolutions Viz<sup>t</sup>  
That all Persons who shall hereafter be admitted to the Freedom of this  
Company by Redemption shall pay the Sum of Two pounds Eleven  
Shillings - One Guinea of which to be allow'd to the Clerk & Officers  
as usual.

That such persons as shall be admitted to the Freedom of the said  
Company either by Servitude or Patrimony pay the ancient Sum of  
One pound Ten shillings only.

That the Clerk and Beadle for the Time being shall be allowed  
Two shillings in the Pound each for collecting Quarterage.

That the Clerk of this Company shall be allow'd the Sum of Thirty  
Pounds p<sup>a</sup> Annum Salary in lieu of all Fees, excepting for the Admission  
of Redemptioners and for the Receipt of Quarterage as before mentioned

That the last Years Account be settled with the Clerk on the Terms  
express'd in the above Resolution.
