

First Prize of £50 should be assigned to a Phantasy bearing the motto "Spec Melicai" (N° 52) This was found to be by Mr Frank Bridge of 50 Elm Park Mansions Chelsea a former Scholar of the Royal College of Music and who has already won one of the Musicians Company's Composition Prizes and has had a Symphonic Poem played at the Queens Hall Symphony Concerts

His work is a fine piece of dramatic instrumental music broadly conceived brilliant in effect and quite up to the highest type of modern musicianship. It is laid out in the manner prescribed in the conditions

The Second Prize of £10 presented by Mr H. L. Sternberg was assigned to a M. S. composition with the motto "Victor" (N° 24) This proved to be by Mr James Fiskin of 43 Keir Street, Pollockshields Glasgow a former Student of the Royal College of Music who obtained the Medal of the Company in 1906 and has also won one of the former Phantasy Prizes

He has furnished an imaginative work, melodious, containing much freshness of thought, and is cleverly constructed

The Third Prize of £10 also provided by Mr Sternberg was assigned for a piece bearing the motto "Sub Umbra" (N° 111) This was found to be by Mr John Ireland of 54 Elm Park Mansions Chelsea Mr Ireland obtained a Composition scholarship at the Royal College of Music and holds the diplomas of Associate of the College and is a Fellow of the Royal College of Organists

The work is a well-built pleasing composition and displays effective treatment of the instruments employed
