Upon a Motion being made, by Mr. Weston and seconded by Mr. Rutter That no Person who shall have compounded with his Creditors or become Bankrupt and not paid, twenty shillings in the pound shall in future be eligible as a Candidate for the Office of either of the Wardens or Master of this Company - And the Question being put, the same was carried, unanimously in the Affirmative

It was also Moved by Mr. Weston and seconded by Mr. Rutter That the Committee take into consideration a Motion of the 10th October 1804 and the Order made thereon and report their Opinion as to the propriety of reducing the Term of 3 years thereby required for Members to have been on the Court previous to their eligibility to serve the Offices of this Company as that period of time appears to be longer than is necessary.
