The Master suggested that the Company should initiate the erection of a Monument in St. Pauls Cathedral in memory of the Band of the S.S. "Titanic" who were reported to have gone down with the Ship playing "Nearer my God to Thee" as an act of heroism unprecedented in musical history Alderman Cooper thought the Members of the Company would be willing to pay the expense of such a Monument without appealing to the general public at all. Sir Frederick Bridge suggested the advisability of waiting until the full facts of the case had been authenticated and the following Members of the Court were appointed a Committee to deal with the matter with full power to act as they thought best and with power to add to their number viz the Master, Warden, Sir Homewood Crawford D^r J. Lea Southgate, and Captain A. C. Chamber
