

A Meeting of the Livery

steps taken in connexion with the proposed exhibition

Fifteen Members of the company attended and Sir Homwood Crawford
the Chairman of the exhibition committee made a statement as to the present
position of affairs and informed the Meeting that including the £150 voted
by the Court he had actually received promises amounting in all to £794.
Various suggestions were made and questions were answered by Sir Homwood
Crawford and on the proposition of the Rev. St. J. Cart M.A. seconded by
Mr. W. H. Ash J.P. it was unanimously resolved

"That the Livery cordially welcome the proposal to hold an
exhibition of Musical Instruments and Manuscripts in Fishmongers Hall
in July 1904 and will use their best endeavours to make it a
success both as regards raising the guarantee fund and in making the
exhibition known to their friends."
