

All a Meeting of the Livery

on Tuesday the 21st July 1903
of the company held at the Parish Clerks'
Hall 24 Silver Street Wood Street E.C.

(Kindly lent for the occasion by the Master and
 Wardens of the Parish Clerks Company) to receive a
Report from the Exhibition Committee as to the
 steps taken in connection with the proposed exhibition
of Musical Instruments and Manuscripts to be held in
Fishmongers' Hall in July 1904.

Fifteen Members of the company attended and Sir Homewood Crawford
 the Chairman of the Exhibition Committee made a statement as to the present
position of affairs and informed the Meeting that including the £150 voted
by the Court he had actually received promises amounting in all to £794.
Various suggestions were made and questions were answered by Sir Homewood
Crawford and on the proposition of the Rev. H. J. Cart M.A. seconded by
M^r W. H. Ash J.P. it was unanimously resolved

"That the Livery cordially welcome the proposal to hold an
 "Exhibition of Musical Instruments and Manuscripts in Fishmongers Hall
 "in July 1904 and will use their best endeavours to make it a
 "success both as regards raising the Guarantee Fund and in making the
 "Exhibition known to their friends."

On the proposition of M^r John Westrope seconded by M^r C.L. Colhard
