Account and found the Balance of Cash in Hand to be £30.7.0

The Beadle inform'd the Committee that he was in great

Whereupon the Committee agreed to report his Case to the  
next Court, and desired the Master to advance a Guinea for his  
immediate Relief.

of April 1777.
