Sir Homewood Crawford reported that the Committee appointed at the last Court had met the Committee of the Pewterers Company and that the Master Warden Sir Frederick Bridge and himself had been appointed a Sub-Committee to make definite arrangements. The Committee now presents the Final Report of the scheme for giving Prizes for selected pieces of music written in Military music form

Since the last Court was held the Committee has met to consider the disposal of the five pieces to which Prizes were awarded. It was determined to offer the publishing and performing rights in these to London Publishers who issue this particular class of music and amounts were suggested at which they might be disposed of. Authority was given to the Master to vary the conditions in case of necessity

The Publishers were then communicated with and after negotiation the pieces have been placed at the prices named by the Committee
