The Clerk was instructed to notify this resolution to the Secretary of the Guilddhall School of Music and at the same time to request that all future references to Scholarships granted to the Guilddhall School of Music by the Company should be headed "The Musicians Company's Carnegie (Ernest Palmer or Composition) Scholarship" as the case may be
