Bollard Fellowship

Committee's Report

The sub-committee appointed to deal with the Bollard Bequest presented their Report to the Court as follows:-

" At a meeting of the Committee appointed by the Court of the Musicians' Company to consider and make suggestions as to the use of the income arising from the Bequest, it was generally agreed that the most appropriate and desirable manner of applying the income (or part of it) would be found in the establishment of a Fellowship of Music, to be called "The John Clementi Bollard Fellowship of the Worshipful Company of Musicians in the City of London," the emoluments of which should be not less than £250 nor more than £300 per annum.

" The Committee were strongly of opinion that in establishing what is likely to be the best endowed Fellowship for music in this country, the Musicians' Company would be not only suitably perpetuating the name of an honoured member of the Company, and one of its most generous
