Past Master Edgar referred to the Resolution of 24th April 1928 under which the suspension of Court attendance fees now came up for review and he stated that he thought this was necessary so as not to bind the Courts successors to the abolition of Court fees altogether. He moved that the Court regret that in their opinion the finances of the Company did not yet justify the resumption of fees and adjourn the question for a further twelve months. The Motion was seconded by the Junior Warden and unanimously carried.

The Treasurer referred to an appeal for a contribution by the Company towards the ^{Third} Choirs Festival, Worcester, but it was considered that the object of the Fund, not being wholly within the scope of the Company's benevolence, the papers should lie on the table.

On the proposition of Past Master Hill, seconded by Past Master Edgar, Mr Alfred Beit was elected a member of the Company.

On the proposition of the Master, seconded by Past Master Hill, Capt. George Miller, L.R.A.M. was elected a member of the Company under the special Resolution for the admission of prominent professional Musicians, which would complete the number, namely ten, allowed at one time on the Livery.

The Committee appointed to consider and submit names at the Court for the filling of the vacancy in the office of Clerk suggested the election of Mr Arthur Charles Knight, J.P. Solicitor, of 33, Wallbrook, E.C. as the new Clerk and on the proposition of Past Master Major A.C. Chamber, seconded by Past Master E.B. Hoare, Mr A.C. Knight was unanimously elected Clerk to the Company for the remainder of the Master's year.
