A Motion being made by Mr. Huson and duly seconded  
 Viz<sup>o</sup> That no Person admitted on the Court of Assistants  
 shall in future be elected a Warden, until he has been on the  
 Court Three Years:... And that the Wardens, in case of Necessity,  
 shall be chosen out of the Members, that have passed the Chair;  
 The same was carried in the Affirmative.
