The Rev. H. J.Cart's Prizesin connectionwith theExhibition

A letter was read from the Rev. H. J. Cart complaining that no mention was made of the Donor's name in the Programme on the occasion of the Master's Banquet on the 9<sup>th</sup> July last when the Prizes were distributed and several of the compositions were performed. The Clerk pointed out that he and several Members of the Exhibition Committee were under the impression that M<sup>r</sup> Cart did not wish his name to publicly appear in connection with the Prizes and that they should be treated as having been given by the Company and stated that on receiving M<sup>r</sup> Cart's letter he had arranged that full prominence of the exact facts should appear in the "London Argus" of the 16<sup>th</sup> July a copy of which had been sent to every Member of the Company

The Clerk also explained that in omitting M<sup>r</sup> Cart's name he was following the precedent adopted in the case of the presentation of M<sup>r</sup> Brows' Prizes for the Grace Competitions and his action was approved and on the proposition of the Senior Warden seconded by Sir Frederick Bridge it was resolved that a reply should be sent to M<sup>r</sup> Cart to the above effect such reply to be in a form to be approved by Sir Homewood Crawford.
