Orlando Gibbons Memorial

P. M. Chamier suggested that the Company should be officially represented at the special service to be held at Canterbury Cathedral on Friday, the 5th June, in commemoration of the Tercentenary of Orlando Gibbons, but it was felt that the distance was too great. Mayor Chamier said that he would attend if he possibly could as a representative of the Company, and he wished the Clerk to communicate with the Cathedral authorities to see if seats could be reserved, if desired. On the suggestion of P. M. Hill, it was decided to hold an Orlando Gibbons Celebration on the 14th July, by a Dinner at Stationers Hall, at which the Livery could be invited to take tickets, and that guests, including Ladies, should be invited. Mr. Hill undertook to arrange the music, and his suggestion was unanimously adopted.
