Clerkship

The clerk read a Statement in the following terms as to the continuation by him of his Office of Clerkship

As I intimated to a previous Court I am afraid it will be impossible for me to continue the Clerkship of the Company unless certain rearrangements are made which would have the effect of considerably lessening the amount of detail work involved. I never anticipated when I accepted the Clerkship of the Company that so many matters of detail would be left to the clerk. In my experience in the past in the case of other Companies such matters have been in the hands of Sub-Committees.

If the following suggestions are adopted I shall be pleased to continue the clerical arrangements and the general work appertaining to the Company which I consider are matters which should properly be left to the Clerk.

I suggest however in the interests of efficiency and the proper working of the Company that Sub-Committees should be constituted to deal with the following matters

- (1) To arrange the musical programmes, choice of menus, toasts and seating arrangements or receiving names of those attending from the Clerk and to arrange with the Printers as to the
