Mr Alderman Cooper raised the question of limiting the number of the Company's Liverymen which the Clerk stated would amount to 136 when the five new Liverymen had been admitted that evening. Alderman Cooper said that the Government looked with suspicion at the increase of faggot votes and moved that it was undesirable at the present time for the Livery to exceed 150 This was seconded by Sir Homewood Crawford and carried unanimously
