

The Archdeacon of London in the name of the Dean accepted the charge in an address dealing with the history of S. Cecilia, so far as it is known and stating how pleased the Cathedral Authorities were that the Musicians Company had revived the ancient custom of attending a religious service on S. Cecilia's Day which custom it was hoped would be permanently kept up

After the Dedication Service the Members of the Company returned in the same Processional order to the Lord Mayor's Visby and at 11 o'clock proceeded in the same order to seats reserved for them in the Choir to attend Evening the only difference in the second procession being that the Company's Banner was carried by Mr. Bagnall one of the Staff of the Cathedral immediately in front of the Chaplain and that Sir Frederick Bridge was unable to take part having another engagement
