Treasurers
Accounts for 1906
The Treasurer presented his Accounts for 1906 (which had been previously audited by Mess^{rs} J. H. Skilbeck and C. J. D. Crews two of the Trustees) in the form of an Income and Expenditure Account for the year which showed a balance in hand on the 31st December last of £133.18.9

The Treasurer explained that the Accounts compared favorably with the previous year as the estimated value of Wine in hand was £150 but he thought that perhaps too much was being spent on elaborate Programmes. The Reverend R. H. Hadden approved of the Account but enquired if there was any fixed rule as to the investment of fees received. The Treasurer stated that it was the rule to invest 50 per cent of the fees and the Clerk read the Minute to this effect (Ante p. 140) as to which Mr. Hadden expressed himself satisfied and on the proposition of Mr. Southgate seconded by Sir Frederick Budge it was unanimously resolved that the Treasurer's statement was highly satisfactory and a hearty vote of thanks was accorded to him for the trouble he had taken in the matter.
