A letter from the Secretary of the Incorporated Society of Musicians asking whether the Company would appoint a representative to form one of a deputation to the Minister of Education with reference to the registration of qualified teachers of music was considered Mr Cooper read a letter which he had received from Mr Runeman the Minister of Education on the subject and expressed the hope that the Master would consent to go as the representative of the Company in his dual capacity of Lord Mayor and Master Sir Homewood Crawford suggested that the Senior Warden be added so that he might go in case the Master's engagements prevented him from attending

The Junior Warden thought perhaps it might be better for the Company not to take part in the deputation and Mr Lollard
