Accounts

The Treasurer presented his Accounts for 1922, which had been duly audited by P. M. Major A. G. Chamier and P. M. Wyatt. The Treasurer stated that the total of the Company's income proper now amounted to £433. 13. 5 per annum, and that he had invested £217. 15. 8 out of the Company's cash during 1922. He further stated that the Company's capital had been increased during the year to the extent of £430. 16. 10, and that during his Treasurership, he had invested every year more than 2/3^{rds} of the Livery fees received. The Master thought that the fine of £10. 10. 0 paid by a new Master, on taking office, was far too small. The Accounts were unanimously received, and adopted, and on the proposition of the Master, seconded by the Junior Warden, the Treasurer and Auditor, including P. M. Burnett Brown, who had checked the Wine, were thanked for their services. A copy of the Accounts appears on the next page.
