read and confirmed.

Nine of the above-written Gentlemen of the Court received

Nomination for the same.

Favour of M<sup>r</sup> Humphreys; he was thereupon declared duly  
elected, sworn and paid £10. 10. 0.

The Master appointed a Committee to be held at the

And the Annual Stewards Feast to be held at the London  
Tavern on Thursday the 14<sup>th</sup> day of July following.

Ordered a new and correct List of the Sivery, and Books  
of the Company to be printed by M<sup>r</sup> Harrison.

Ordered the usual Number of Tickets for the Stewards  
Feast.
