At the Court Dinner of the Musicians' Company, given in Stationers' Hall on Tuesday evening, the music performed was a selection from the compositions to which prizes were awarded in the Cart and Cobbett competitions. The three new Phantasies by Mr. W. Y. Hurlstone, Mr. Haydn Wood, and Mr. Frank Bridge were played by the Saunders Quartet, and these novel pieces excited a great deal of interest. Miss Beatrice Hughes-Pope sang the three songs in "Praise of Music," by Miss May Dawson, which gained one of the Cart Prizes, and Mr. John Saunders played, to Mr. Stanley Hawley's accompaniment, Dr. H. W. Wareing's "Spanish Shepherd's Song," which also obtained a Cart Prize. Thus the old City Guild encourages the performance as well as the production of music by our native composers.
