(2) To purchase and check stores of wines and cigars consumed at
the Court and Livery Dinners and to satisfy the Auditors
requirements in connection therewith

I also suggest that the Company should instruct Auditors at the
expense of the Company in the usual way to prepare the annual
Accounts and Balance Sheets and the various Income and Corporation
Tax Returns and to deal with the Inland Revenue requirements regarding
the same.

It was Resolved after discussion that a Committee of three members
of the Court be appointed to enquire into the clerical work of the
Company and the matter of detail involved which had hitherto been
dealt with by the Clerk.

The Clerk then formally tendered his resignation in view of the
circumstances explained by him and this was accepted by the Court
with regret

The Clerk explained that he did not desire that the Company
should be inconvenienced pending other arrangements being made and
offered to continue with the work of the Company until his
successor had been appointed if he could be relieved of some of
the detailed work referred to in his Statement and this was
accepted by the Company.

The Clerk read a letter from the Secretary of the Lord Mayor
stating that the Lord Mayor would be unable to attend the
Livery Dinner on the 28th October 1930.
