

Arthur Wollman, a Liveryman of the Company, wished to endow a money gift to be given annually, to a Violin Student of limited means, studying at the Royal College of Music, the administration of the gift to be in the hands of the Director of that Institution, and informed the Court that Mr Wollman had sent him a cheque for £100 for the purpose of which he had placed on deposit, pending the decision of the Court. It was unanimously resolved to accept Mr Wollman's gift, and the Clerk was instructed to convey the thanks of the Court to her for her liberality.

N.B. It was subsequently arranged between Mr Wollman and the Treasurer, Mr Hill, that the gift should be known as "The Wollman Memorial Gift endowed by Mr Wollman in memory of her husband, a Violinist, and Liveryman of the Musicians Company"

St. Cecilia
Celebration

A letter was read from the Revd. W. F. Foxell, the Succentor of St. Paul's Cathedral, suggesting that the St. Cecilia Celebration should be held on Monday, the 24th November, instead of Saturday, the 22nd, as another special service had been fixed for the evening of that day, and it was decided to hold the Celebration on the 24th accordingly.

N.B. A letter was subsequently received by the Clerk from the Revd. W. F. Foxell, stating that the Dean and Chapter had decided it would be more suitable to sing special Psalms at the Service, the Psalm for the 22nd Evening not being appropriate to the occasion, and that they had, therefore, decided to make the change this year, and that Psalms 71 and 81 had been selected. A suggestion to this effect was made by the Court to the Dean of St. Paul's in 1921 (ant. pages 247 and 248), although the Psalms now chosen are different from those then suggested.
