

Lord Mayor's Procession } It was resolved that the Company which was the Lord Mayor elect's parent Company should take part in the Lord Mayor's procession on Saturday the 8th November next and the Clerk was instructed to make the necessary arrangements

Pamphlet of War work } In the absence of P-M Major Chomier through indisposition P-M Edgar reported that further questions had been sent out to the various members of the Company and that the Pamphlet was in draft and he hoped it would be ready for distribution shortly.

Priendergast Trust } The Clerk reported the result of a Meeting which had been held by the Committee of the Priendergast Trust before the Meeting of the Court and that P-M Hill had kindly undertaken to take over the management of the Trust temporarily which was approved. The Treasurer was authorised to pay the Clerk a fee of £5.5/- in settlement of the work he had had to do in connection with the Trust.

Master } P-M Hoblyn moved that Alderman Sir Edward Ernest Cooper Lord Mayor Elect be elected Master for the ensuing year. This was seconded by the Master and carried with acclamation and the new Master briefly returned thanks.
