

Stationers Hall

A letter was read from the Clerk of the Stationers Company stating that his Court thought the annual payment made for the use of the Stationers Hall should be increased from 60 Guineas to 100 Guineas

The Master stated that he and the Clerk had had an interview with Mr. Livington on the subject and thought there was no doubt that if an offer to pay an annual sum of 80 Guineas were made it would be accepted upon the honorable understanding that the amount should not be further increased. Sir George Fuscott said he did not agree with the action of the Stationers Company of the Court of which he was a Member and he advised that an offer of 80 Guineas should be made which he thought would probably be accepted

Mr. Littleton as the President of the Livery Club stated that the Committee of that Club had passed a resolution to subscribe 10 Guineas for one year towards the payment of any extra amount but that the Club could not be bound beyond a year as they wished a free hand with regard to the place of holding their Meetings

Sir Homewood Crawford proposed that the arrangement made by the Master with Mr. Livington should be accepted. This was seconded by the Treasurer and carried and the Clerk was instructed to communicate with Mr. Livington accordingly
