

property otherwise than as gratuitous bailees

If the Musicians Company desire to form a Library the Stationers Company to afford them reasonable facilities for so doing but without any obligation on the Stationers Company in this respect

The Musicians Company to be entitled to address their letters from Stationers Hall if desired and to treat the Stationers Hall as their official address if they think fit

The Musicians Company to be entitled to employ such caterers for their Dinners as they may think fit

The Musicians Company to be responsible for all damage done to the property of the Stationers Company through the user of the premises by the Musicians Company

The Musicians Company to pay the Stationers Company Fifteen Guineas per quarter to include lights and the heating of the Hall and Reception Rooms & as usually lighted and heated for the Stationers Company but not coal for cooking dinners which is to be provided by the caterers employed by the Musicians Company

Such payment of Fifteen Guineas a quarter to include the services of any attendants the Stationers Company usually employ upon the premises with the exception of the Porter who is to be paid Ten shillings per every dinner or other entertainment and is in addition to be entitled to retain for his own use any cloak room gratuities

The Society Club of the Musicians Company to be entitled to use the Hall Reception Rooms & on two evenings every year at convenient dates without payment beyond the cost of heating and lighting to be settled by the Clerk of the Stationers Company and the Porters fee of Ten shillings
