The Minutes of the last Court and Business done since were read and confirmed.

Mr Gough reported to this Court that he had purchased 200^l Old South Sea Annuities at 72^l Cent amounting to 144^l the same being transferred into the names of Mr Wadd, Mr Rutter & Mr Gough, Esq^r Trustees for the Company. And this makes the Company's Stock in Total amount to 7000^l Old South Sea Annuities.

The Stamp Duties Ordered by the last Court, not being paid
It is now Ordered That they be paid up to the present day.

And that the Warden in case of necessity shall be chosen out of the Members who have passed the Chair" - Which on the Question being put was carried in the affirmative.

making a Balance of Sixty six pounds six shillings
and sixpence due from him to the Company and
now remaining in his hands for their use.

The late Master reported to the Committee that 75 of the Tivery of this Company dined at the last annual Feast at Canonbury Tavern; And that he had discharged the Bill for same amounting to 78[£] including the usual Gratuities to the Waiters.

The late Master's Account with the Company for the last year was then audited and compared with the several Vouchers. And it appears thereby that he has received for their use the sum of 35[£] 7^s 6^d and disbursed on their Account 29[£] 11^s 8^d making a Balance of 53[£] 4^s 10^d due from him to the Company Which the late Master paid over to the present Master accordingly.

The Clerk's Account for the same year was also audited; And it appears that he has disbursed for the Company's Use so much as with his Fees and Salary amount to 165[£] 19^s 0^d and that he has received on their Account the sum of 163[£] 1^s 0^d making a Balance of 2[£] 18^s 0^d due to him from the Company. Which the Master paid him accordingly.

The Beadle's Account for the same year was likewise presented & audited by this Committee making a Balance of 7[£] 7^s 6^d due to him from the Company after deducting 10[£] 4^s 0^d for Quarterage collected by him to October 1821. Which the Master also paid him accordingly.
