The late Master (Mr Thomas Fellows's) Accounts were
audited and after having compared them minutely with the several
Vouchers, it appears that he has disbursed for the Company's
Use the sum of 177^l 7^s 0^d and received the sum
of 150^l 15^s 6^d making a Balance due to him of 26^l 11^s 6^d

The Clerk's Account of his Fees Salary and Disbursements
amounting to 52^l 15^s and of his Receipts for the Company's
use amounting to 16^l 9^s 4^d was also audited by which
there appears to be due to him a Balance of 36^l 5^s 8^d

And also the Beadle's Account, whereupon a Balance
remains due to him of 7^l 8^s 0^d
