

We see no objection to the Court placing this object before the Livery and asking for their assistance in guaranteeing the sum required.

In order to provide an opportunity for so doing, Mr. W. N. P. Leslie, with the sanction of the Court, is prepared to provide the funds necessary for a Special Livery Dinner at which a few of the more prominent members of the League might be invited to place before the Company an official account of the ideals of the League.

The present time offers unique opportunity for furthering a love of the arts among the English people, and it is felt that the position already obtained by the League of Arts under the inspiring management of Captain Frank Thistleton gives great encouragement that full value in this direction would be obtained from an association with that Body.
