The Minutes and proceedings of the Court held on the 25<sup>th</sup> October  
1904 and of the Special Court held on the 21<sup>st</sup> November 1904 were  
read and confirmed

Mess<sup>rs</sup> Alfred Henry Littleton and Arthur Frederick Hill F.S.A. attended  
and took the Assistants Declaration. They were welcomed to the Court by

the Master and formally introduced to the other members present

A letter was read from Mr. William Palmer Fuller expressing regret at  
his inability to attend the Court on account of absence from England and  
stating that he hoped to take up his duties at the next Court

The Treasurer presented his Accounts for 1904 (which had previously been  
audited by the Trustees) and explained that there was at present a balance  
for 1904
