The Junior Fellowship worth £12,000 was awarded to Denise Mulholland. The committee was impressed by her idea of the need for extra communication between the schools and colleges. It was a concept which had the whole-hearted support of the RCM. At Glasgow University she gained an MA (Drama) thereafter ARCM (Perf), ARCM (Teaching), Dip RCM (Postgraduate). Her opera experience includes numerous roles with Glyndebourne and English Touring Operas and Opera North. She has also appeared in several plays and musicals.

An additional award of a £5,000 scholarship was made to Sarah Thurlow who plays clarinet. Twelve awards of £1,000 were made to promising students in various different fields.

Consequently, the annual grants have been reorganised in consultation with the RCM. In future they will comprise the Junior Fellowship worth £12,000, two postgraduate studentships worth £6,000 each and five awards of £1,000.
